Quilt Guild of Greater Victoria General Meeting

August 25, 2022

38 members present + 3 guests (Jan Barrow, Margaret Charnetski, and Debbie Baker)

President: Karen Greer called the meeting to order at 09:30 a.m. Guests were welcomed.

Treasurer: Lynn Miori read the treasurer's report which was filed for audit.

H.O.T. funds: Karen Greer noted that H.O.T. funds would be received for 2023.

Newsletter: Penny was thanked for her work on the newsletter.

Membership: Linda Jean reported that the guild currently has 70 members and that she is working on the 2023 yearbook; member information would be available for proof at the October meeting. She will begin collecting 2023 yearly dues beginning at the October meeting with membership dues due by the end of January 2023. Membership dues for 2023: \$25 for members under 60 years of age; \$20 for members ages 60-80; and members 80+ years of age are free. Any member not wanting membership or the newsletter should notify Linda Jean. Linda Jean was in the process of photographing members for the yearbook.

Houston Bus Trip: Deadline to register for the bus trip to the Houston International Quilt Show is September 30, 2022, with payment due by the October meeting. The cost for Victoria guild members is \$55; the non-member cost is \$65. An invitation has been extended to the Port Lavaca quilt guild. Payments should be given to Samantha Amador. The bus trip is scheduled for Friday, November 4th with meeting place yet to be determined. The plan is to leave Houston around 2:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. with a stop at Prasek's on the way back.

Quilt Show: Kathy Sheeran noted that money for the donation quilt is being received and can also be received at the quilt show. She thanked members for items given for the sampler store. Sampler store items include any items up to a \$25 value.

Anna Harrison discussed items needed for the silent auction. Pat Johnson and Kathy Sheeran showed a quilt to be donated for the silent auction which was made from left over batiks from the donation quilt.

Scrap drive booth will sell packets of charm packs (#42), jelly rolls (#10), crumb bags, and fat quarter (#3) for \$5 each. There will also be a "dive bag" available for \$5.

Entrance fee is free to volunteers. If a member wishes to vote, entrance fee is \$8 or \$7 with a canned good. There are 137 available slots to volunteer, each are 2-hour shifts with 3 shifts/day. Members should wear name tags to the quilt show.

Karen noted that there will be a special exhibit at the quilt show highlighting the community service quilts for Joseph's Warriors and Mid-Coast Family Services.

Discussion was held regarding quilt show entries. Debbie Ganem will notify Robin of the number of quilt entries. Members were asked to send quilt stories to Debbie via email. Currently, there is a four-quilt limit for the show. A Bargello quilt exhibit is planned. Members should bring quilts on Thursday, September 22. Mission Valley VFD will hang and remove quilts this year. A food donation canister and donation jar will be available for donations to the Victoria food bank.

Quilt show booth chairmen reported on the status of their booths.

Programs: The August workshop is on tuffets with instruction provided by Karen Greer. There are three extra tuffet kits available for \$65 each.

Winnie Flemming and her daughter for Joseph's Warrior Project will be the program for October.

Anna Harrison will be the instructor for November's workshop on selvage bags. A supply list will be sent in the September newsletter.

Bronte Bee: Twelve members attended the bee in August. Bronte Bee will be cancelled for the rest of the year.

Miscellaneous: Pat Johnson discussed the Silver Thimble nominations. The nomination forms and a list of previous winners were available. Members can email Pat their nominations for the award.
